Giacomo A. M. Ponzetto earned his PhD in Economics at Harvard University in 2009. Currently he is a Senior Researcher at the Center for Research in International Economics (CREI) and the Institute of Political Economy and Governance (IPEG), and a professor at Universitat Pompeu Fabra and the Barcelona Graduate School of Economics. He has been a Visiting Professor at Harvard and Bocconi. He is a Research Fellow at the CEPR, a co-editor of the *Journal of the European Economic Association* and an editorial board member of the *Review of Economic Studies*. His research interests include political economics, economic geography and international trade. He has published articles in numerous scientific journals on topics such as the geographic structure of government; the impact of asymmetric information on economic policy-making; legal institutions and the development of regulation; and urban growth dynamics, human capital and innovation.
