She is Professor at Universitat Pompeu Fabra (UPF), Affiliated Professor at the Barcelona GSE, and Research Associate at CREI. She is currently Director of the Barcelona GSE, and has been Vice-rector of Scientific Policy, Chair of the Department of Economics and Business and Dean of the Undergraduate Studies in Economics at UPF. She has served as President of the Spanish Economic Association (2014).
